A WORD FROM OUR SERVANT GENERAL

Hello to you, "pilgrims of hope",

The Holy Year, that began on December 8, 2024, has led us to become prophets of hope. We were in Rome for the solemnity of Pentecost. With more that 70,000 people who came for the jubilee of ecclesiastical movements and renewal communities, Pope Leo XIV said: "The future will be less dark, the discernment less difficult, if together we obey the Holy Spirit." What a special program for the Church and for us! This year, let us answer joyfully to this invitation. Yes, together, let us obey the Holy Spirit and, as with the first Christians:

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." (Acts 2, 42) How? A simple method, that of which Jesus spoke to us in the Gospel and that Sister Jeanne has left us: Marvel, that we always be in communion with each other, obeying the Holy Spirit.

Pilgrims moving forward, that is what describes our family life this year. A profound desire to open ourselves to God and to our brothers and sisters in our daily lives:

*SILENCE: Interior silence, to keep silent, to forget oneself, to pray, to give of oneself, to make commitments;

*DIALOGUE: Humble dialogue in one's persevering and fruitful endeavors;

*DOCILITY: by listening to the Holy Spirit during community prayer so as to truly welcome God's will in all that happens;

*EXPERIENCE OF PROVIDENCE: in our daily lives, as children who put their hope in all that the Father gives.

Let us see how this work of communion is fruitful in each of our foyers.

Myriam-de-la-Paix (Tracadie-Sheila)

Together, one loves, one welcomes and one gives of oneself: this is what allows relationships of trust and friendship to form. These ties build a Family-Church: through catechism instructing and accompanying adolescents and adults: through the welcoming of families one day a month; through the group "Live your baptism" during which fraternal ties in faith are made: through monthly days of "spiritual renewal" with our dear brother Father Delvida Leblanc who celebrates his 90th birthday this year and who is unfailing in his fervor. Creativity is not lacking in this foyer: artistic productions allow all to highlight important moments of the liturgical year.

Myriam-de-la-Vallée (Lac-au-Saumon)

The Family grows in its mutual fraternal welcoming, allowing us to live a special complementarity with simplicity. This year the Youth-Challenge II weekends (14-17 year olds) resumed where they had started. The young people left renewed in their joy, their fervor, and with a living strength to move forward in their faith. A



new group of Friends of Myriam, to journey toward the Yes of Baptism, was started. Family celebrations allowed us to express our thanks and joy with those who share our life and mission.

Myriam-de-la-Miséricorde (Mont St-Hilaire)

The team of Myriam-dela-Miséricorde is well established in its new environment. Surrounded by nature, silence and the presence of God, the house draws and invites one to lift one's gaze to the Above. The Youth-

Myriam-Providence (Québec)

Myriam-Providence is the hub for little brothers and sisters coming and going, a stop that renews hearts through welcoming and that is always warm and joyful. The house is always full. Thursday evening prayer is open to all and brings young and old together. Throughout such intense activity, each person keeps his and her



intimate fervor with the Lord and as such is able to maintain the rhythm. This mission is the first that was

founded after the Mother House, already 45 years ago! Its history is rich and important to us. Now is the time to gather our memories, our documents and to put some order in it all so as to give this heritage to those who come after us. Our little sisters Dominique Horodynski (archivist) and Geneviève Gadbois have undertaken painstakingly this vast project which requires much time and patience. The Myriam-sur-Mer household works quietly. Between wind and water, there is the space to move towards the discovery of one's identity, a child of God. through the

Myriam-des-Prairies (McLean, Saskatchewan)


